



Champion Job Role



Overall champions are responsible for sharing knowledge with their teams to ensure joint working and the 'Think Family Approach' is embedded throughout services. BY:

- Gaining a clear understanding of other champions' roles and services. This should be achieved through 'Champion Group Sessions' and 'buddying'/Joint Working.
- Acting as a resource to their team regarding the use and understanding of the Joint working Protocol.
- Attending multi-agency training sessions pertinent to 'Think Family' working.
- Briefing their team at team meetings on the 'Think Family' developments and aims, joint working and best practice.
- Reminding colleagues of the 'Think Family' joint working aims when specific cases indicate collaborative working.
- Attending and contributing to the 'Think Family' champion group meetings.
- Attending other agency team meetings to inform staff of their services and role.
- Collating and keeping an up-to-date resource file for their team. This should include information on various agencies and resources for families.
- Act as a role model for joint working by undertaking joint assessments with other agencies and be involved with multi agency care planning for specific cases.
