

## SOCIAL CARE TEAMS

### Using the Learning Organisation Pack to support Practice Learning

The suggestions below are divided up into ideas for three different time frames:

1. Areas of *'immediate'* potential use, where a suggestion could be taken up quickly and incorporated into an existing process.
2. Areas where there may be a series of steps necessary to develop the ideas suggested, and which may be more *'medium term'* (for example using one person to cascade ideas to others, need to set up specific groups or meetings in advance)
3. Areas that could be considered as part of *'long-term planning'*, requiring a substantial commitment. (The words 'agency' and 'organisation' are used interchangeably to describe the social care delivery group, ie CSSR, Children's Trust, Adult Care Trust etc.)

#### THE CARDS

The different cards, in their specific sections, are referred to in the following ways:

<b>KC</b>	Key Characteristics	<i>light green 1-4</i>
<b>K</b>	Knowledge about learning organisations	<i>blue/grey 1-12</i>
<b>ISUC</b>	The informed service user and carer	<i>mauve 1</i>
<b>IFLW</b>	The informed front line worker	<i>pink 1</i>
<b>IPM</b>	The informed policy maker	<i>grey/green 1-3</i>
<b>R</b>	References	<i>brown 1-2</i>

#### POTENTIAL FOR USE

(Field, or day care or residential)

##### 1. Immediate

At a team meeting, introduce the pack and select **one or more cards** to discuss at a subsequent meeting. Some team members might agree to follow up some of the references, either via the pack notes or by going to the source.

##### 2. Medium Term

Look at team development in terms of Learning Organisation principles, using card **K2** at a specially convened meeting.

##### 3. Longer Term

Work through the **pack** as a team exercise over the course of a year.
